	<b>Post #4 is a message that highlights 3 links relevant to ONE (Social Studies Curriculum) strand expectation from Ontario Curriculum Standards. The strand expectation should be clearly explained and the links should support learning that concept ONLY.</b>
	<b>Post #5 is a message that highlights 3 links relevant to ONE (Mathematics Curriculum) strand expectation from Ontario Curriculum Standards. The strand expectation should be clearly explained and the links should support learning that concept ONLY.</b>
	<b>Post #6 is a message that highlights 3 links relevant to ONE (Science Curriculum) strand expectation from Ontario Curriculum Standards. The strand expectation should be clearly explained and the links should support learning that concept ONLY.</b>
	<b>Post #7 is a message that highlights 3 links relevant to ONE (Language Arts Curriculum) strand expectation from Ontario Curriculum Standards. The strand expectation should be clearly explained and the links should support learning that concept ONLY.</b>

- ✓ Having homework resources within your blog is a plus. Links to educational support sites, such as [www.dictionary.com](http://www.dictionary.com), limits student surfing and provides parents with tools to help their children.
- ✓ Keep your site upbeat, engaging, and informative.
